### TEACHERS AS LEAD LEARNERS

Last week in our professional learning meeting, teachers learned the importance of spaced practice and retrieval to ensure knowledge goes from a child's short term, to long term, memory. As part of this learning teachers are beginning Daily Reviews in maths. This is a whole class, fastpaced routine of 10-15 minutes, where students Recite, Recall and Apply their knowledge of known mathematical concepts. Students have been excited to try this routine giving their teachers instant feedback on whether they have learned the mathematical concepts and how they can adjust their future lessons to ensure continual student growth and achievement. Teachers will continue to learn and refine their practice in Daily Reviews and Explicit Instruction as it aligns to our School Improvement Plan.

### EASTER HAT PARADE THIS THURSDAY 9.30AM

This Thursday we will be holding our annual Easter Hat Parade at 9.30am. Weather permitting we would love to host this event again on our bottom oval as I think all would agree this provided a lovely atmosphere last year however it will depend obviously on how much rain we get between now and then. 


